

"The Seabees were established in the dark days following the attack on Pearl Harbor to answer the crucial demand for builders that could fight. The Seabees have a longstanding tradition of support to the National Military Strategy through contingency construction since their establishment in 1942. The Seabees are a proud and dedicated force with proven warfighting competence and character."

NAVFAC Commander and Chief of Civil Engineers Rear Adm. Bret Muilenburg echoed similar sentiments in a video message aired during the Ball. "This year marks the 75th anniversary of the Seabees, a fighting group that I've been proud to be a part of for the past 32 years," said Muilenburg. "As you celebrate, remember you are part of a proud legacy that has played a major role in every significant military engagement since World War II."
